## Areas Outside Major Concerns

#### 1) Language Policy:

- English is the medium of instruction for all subjects except Chinese Language (S1-6), Chinese History (S1-6), Liberal Studies (S1-6), Religious Education (S1-6), Putonghua (S1-3), Chinese Literature (S4-6) and Ethics & Religious Studies (S4-6).
- In all classes of S1-3, one Chinese lesson per two cycles is taught in Putonghua.
- All school functions are basically conducted in English, while teachers and students are encouraged to use English in informal communications but not compulsory.

## 2) Bring Your Own Designated Device (BYODD) Pilot Scheme:

• The scheme will be run in Class 1R. Parents will join on a voluntary basis. They will purchase and own their own mobile computer devices, while for needy students, subsidies from the Community Care Fund will be applied. The scheme aims at enhancing the trying out of more e-learning strategies and revealing the problems and issues concerned to prepare for wider use of e-learning in other classes and levels in future.

## **3) Promotion of Sports and Healthy Lifestyle:**

- To cater for our students' growing interest in sports and to promote an active and healthy lifestyle, the number of Physical Education lessons will be increased from two per two cycles (Total: 130 mins) to three per two cycles (Total: 195 mins) in S1-3.
- We have joined the Healthy School Programme under the Narcotics Division. The programme will run for three consecutive school years from

2018-2019 onwards. Through the programme, we are given financial subsidies to organize life education programmes for students.

• To increase students' participation in school activities, the "One Sport One Art Programme" will be introduced to S1-3, by which students are required to participate in at least one sport activity and one art (visual art, music, drama, speech etc.) activity. The programme is mandatory to S1 while open to S2-3.

#### 4) Career and Life Planning Education (CLP):

- The CLP Grant has already been turned into a Graduate Master post in the 2016-2017 school year. Apart from careers talks, visits and life-planning workshops, CLP lessons taught by careers teachers will continue to be provided to all S4-6 classes once every two cycles. The content of the lessons include: understanding self and the world of work, developing one's dream and careers aspirations, pathways of further studies, life skills including self-care, social etiquette, interview and presentation skills etc. In junior forms, CLP will continue to take the form of special projects (e.g. interviewing various professions, visiting careers expo, careers day) delivered with the help of the Class Teachers.
- The Careers Mistress will offer individual careers counselling sessions to students on a regular basis.

#### 5) Whole School Approach on Special Educational Needs:

• With the provision of an SEN Coordinator (SENCO) starting from 2018-2019, a Student Support Team will be formed under the SENCO to coordinate all teachers, the School Social Worker and the Educational Psychologist in providing comprehensive support to SEN students. Apart from enhancing the usual services provided to SEN students, support to their parents as well as to the subject teachers will be strengthened.

## 6) Celebration of 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary:

- 2018-2019 is the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the College. A series of activities will be organized to enhance the bonding among all stakeholders, including students, teachers, parents, alumni, the church and the sponsoring body. They include:
  - Founders' Day (3-11-2018): Alumni Homecoming, Thanksgiving Service, Alumni Dinner
  - 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Documentary Film Shows (Premier on 4-11-2018 and a few more subsequent shows, with dates to be confirmed)
  - Open Day cum Information Day (15-12-2018)
  - Sports and Family Fun Day (9-3-2019)

## 7) Use of Grants:

- School-based After-school Learning and Support Programmes Grant: This grant, together with other similar funds and donations, will continue to be used to pay the fees for disadvantaged students to join after-school fee-paying extra-curricular activities and learning programmes. See separate plan.
- Grant for the Sister School Scheme: This fund will be used on exchange and interflow activities with our sister schools on the mainland, namely, ZhuZhou No. 2 High School of Hunan, JianNing Experiment Middle School of ZhuZhou City, and Xi'an Senior High School. Plans will be mapped out with the respective schools in due course.
- Promotion of Reading Grant: See separate plan.
- Capacity Enhancement Grant (CEG): It will be used in the following aspects:
  - Additional staff: Two full time supporting staff will be employed to relieve the workload of the teachers. (Budget: \$448,632)
  - Gifted education: To organize courses for Talent Pool members and to subsidize students to participate in courses outside school. (Budget: \$70,000)
