Dear Alumna / Alumnus,

I write to invite you to join our Mentoring Programme to serve as mentor to our current students.

I thank God for blessing the College with such a rich pool of graduates who are now contributing to the community in various capacities. Our younger generation nowadays is faced with a world that is growing in diversity and challenges. I believe that with your career commitment and your professional experience, your sharing with them will indeed expose them to new dimensions and provide them with more insight in setting their own life goals and planning their career paths.

It is with such aims in mind that the Careers Team of the College has piloted a Mentoring Programme since September 2009. The response from our alumni was encouraging. A total of 34, 27, 41 and 34 alumni became mentors to 88, 70, 68 and 106 Form 4 to Form 7 students for the school years 2008-2009, 2009-2010, 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 respectively. Our overseas mentors, who are alumni now residing in the US or Canada, have received 2, 4 and 2 of our students in summer 2009, 2010 and 2011 respectively. The support shown by our alumni towards the College has been truly impressive. I am particularly grateful to our faithful alumnus, Mr David Chan Tak Chung of Class 1971, who has contributed a lot of his time and effort to help us coordinate the Programme. Apart from inviting our alumni to be mentors, we have also invited distinguished members from Kowloon Methodist Church to join our mentor pool. We have had 4, 7 and 2 Kowloon Methodist Church members joining as our mentors for the school years 2009-2010, 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 respectively.

We wish to build on this success by continuing with the Mentoring Programme in the coming academic year. This is particularly important in the New Senior Secondary curriculum. I sincerely hope that the current mentors could continue to lend their support, while those of you who have been hesitating could decide to join us this time. We welcome mentors from different years and different professions.
